Featured speakers:

- <u>Hedy Epstein</u>: Hedy is a Holocaust survivor who has traveled extensively to share about her Nazi Holocaust experiences, her work at the Nuremberg Medical Trial, and the five trips she has taken to Palestine since 2003 to witness the facts on the ground. She is also known for her social justice work in areas such as fair housing and antiwar activities. In addition, she has appeared on several radio and television shows as a guest. She resides in St. Louis, MO and is a member of the Speakers Bureau of the St. Louis Holocaust Museum and Learning Center.
- <u>Marisa Carr</u>: Marisa is a poet, visual artist, youth worker and organizer who resides in Minneapolis. She has been featured as a performer in various venues around the Twin Cities, including the award-winning Equilibrium spoken word series, as well as in Johannesburg, South Africa. Marisa is Turtle Mountain Ojibwe.
- <u>Amina Maameri</u>, Students for Justice in Palestine, University of Minnesota
- <u>Sanna Towns</u>: Sanna Towns has been an activist in the cause for Palestinian equality and justice for more than 30 years. She has been involved in several national Palestinian justice organizations and conferences, and two fact-finding tours to Palestine-Israel. She has also written several articles and given numerous presentations on the realities of Palestinian life. She has been a member of MN BBC since its inception.

They will also provide insight into what is happening nationally and globally with the Palestinian-led BDS Movement today, and where we are headed tomorrow.

## Featured Speakers Bios:

Jordan Ash has been working in community and union organizing for over twenty years, which he feels is firmly rooted in Jewish values and in his Jewish heritage. After traveling to Israel and the West Bank in 2007 he came back committed to working for peace, justice, and equality in the region. He is on the national board of Jewish Voice for Peace (JVP) and a member of Mount Zion synagogue.

Flo Razowsky is a co-founder of MN BBC and a national organizer with the International Jewish anti-Zionist Network (IJAN). She combines art and community organizing through documentary photography, writing and political activism. Razowsky has spent almost 2 years living in the West Bank and Gaza Strip between 2002 and 2008 both documenting life on the ground and participating in Palestinian organized non-violent resistance.

Sriram Ananth is completing his PhD in Political and Economic Geography and his research focuses on the current Palestinian-led BDS Movement against Israel. He has organized in India, the US, and Canada on issues surrounding labor, gender, and disenfranchisement. was a Core organizer with MN BBC for two years before moving to Toronto, Canada.
